ENTRY DEADLINE: Postmark Wednesday, August 30, 2023 or email so that entries are received by Tuesday, September 5. Late entries accepted as space allows. Late entries may not be listed in the show book. Space is limited – all entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

General Show Policies and Guidelines

These shows are approved by the Alpaca and Llama Show Association Inc. All rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the 2019, 22nd Edition ALSA Handbook. Your ALSA membership number and all ALSA Llama and Alpaca numbers must be on the entry form to ensure accurate reporting to ALSA.

ALSA Membership

An exhibitor who pays a non-member fee in order to enter an ALSA sanctioned show, may choose to apply it toward an ALSA membership.

Animal Registration and Owner-Exhibitor Information

Animals entered only in performance classes, Youth or Open, do not need to be registered. However, if your animal is registered, please include all information on the entry form and enclose a copy of the registration with your entries.

Animals with fleeces being entered in the fleece show, must be registered as appropriate for the animal. All llamas must be registered or have passed screening in the Llama Division of the International Lama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). All alpacas must be registered by the Alpaca Owners Association (AOA), the Alpaca Registry, Inc. (ARI) or by the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). A copy of the registration certificate must be sent to the show with the entry form and included with the fleece entry. Finished product entries must also include ALSA membership information in order for the exhibitor to qualify for point recording.

- Youth may show in either the Youth Performance Classes or Open Performance (novice, advanced, masters), but not in both unless different llamas or alpacas are used. Points earned in the Youth Classes are awarded to the youth, whereas points in Open Performance Classes are awarded to the llama or alpaca.
- All llamas and alpacas must be at least five (5) months old.
- Exhibitors must be the registered owners and must make entries in the exact names (owner and animal) as shown on the animal's registration certificate or other identification papers. Any animal being shown by a handler who is not the owner of that animal must send a completed and signed Permission To Show Form, which can be found on the ALSA website.
- Nursing llama and alpaca mothers may NOT be accompanied in the ring by their babies. We recommend nursing mothers not be shown.

Health Requirements

NO SPECIAL TESTING REQUIRED!

Llamas and alpacas coming into Wyoming from outside of the state should be accompanied with a health certificate issued within 30 days of the show, stating that the animal is in good health and has been administered protection against scabies within that time frame (either Ivomec or Dectomax are acceptable).

Important Exhibitor Requirements Specific to the Higher Ground Fair

- All animals participating in the Higher Ground fair must be checked in by 8:00 p.m. on Friday, September 15 and in place until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 17. Any displays must be functional and ready for full fair

participation from 8:30 a.m. on Saturday until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. No early dismantling of displays or general set-up will be permitted as part of ensuring the ongoing success of this special public event.

- No pets policy: Pets are strictly prohibited from the Fairgrounds, Parking Lots (including parked cars) and Camping Areas. If you are traveling long-distance with your pet(s), please contact a pet kennel in the area. Suggestions are listed on the Higher Ground Fair website at www.highergroundfair.org.

ALSA Fees

Animal Show Fees

All exhibitors must pay the \$5.00 per animal fee. A \$3.00 fee is required per Llama or Alpaca fleece exhibited, if the animal is not concurrently entered in a non-fleece class at the same show. If the animal which grew the fleece is also entered in a non-fleece class in the show, the \$5.00 per animal fee will cover the fleece entry point recording as well as the non-fleece class point recording.

Entry Fees - Special Flat Rates!

- All-Included Youth Classes - \$15/youth exhibitor, unlimited youth performance, fleece, specialty classes
- Llama & Alpaca Performance & Fleece Classes - \$25 per animal, unlimited number of open classes
- Fleece & Fiber Classes Only Option - \$10 per class

Enter as many classes as you like: performance, showmanship, fleece/fiber, specialty!

Stall Fees and Set-up Details

- Stalls are 10' x 10' pens with dirt /grass floors for \$20 each from Friday through Sunday. This applies whether stalls are used for animals, display or as a tack stall. Exhibitors are asked to avoid over-crowding your animals in these stalls. Straw and cardboard bedding is permitted; **cleaning stalls to designated manure collection area after close of fair on Sunday at 4:00 p.m. is required.** Straw purchase at cost is available on site – we would appreciate advance notice if you want to purchase our straw (\$10/bale) - it will be available upon your arrival. Hay availability depends on how the season goes – please contact Gayle in advance for availability of hay.
- Arrival may begin as early as 10:00 a.m. on Friday, and is expected by 8:00 p.m. Full stall and display setup ready for public viewing must be complete by 8:30 a.m. on Saturday.
- In-place requirements: all animals, exhibitor set-up and displays are required to remain in place through the conclusion of the fair at 4:00 p.m. Extensive marketing on your behalf will be taking place, with a promise to the public that the fair will be fully operational until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 17 No stall or display take-down or moving out may take place until that time.

Sale animals not entered in the show will be accepted on a space-available basis (see details on entry form), subject to all health requirements and payment for stall use.

Show Entry Deadline

Entries must be received by Tuesday, September 5. You can email all your entry information and make your payment online (either PayPal or a credit card) using the HGF donation link. Once logged into the form, you'll see the HGF circle logo at the top, with Action Resources International as the name of the form. If you prefer to mail your entries in with a check to pay for them, please **postmark them by Wednesday, August 30** so we receive them on time (it helps if you send an email letting us know they're on the way). This is a halter class judged on a llama's conformational build and general movement as appropriate for pack work in the mountains. Open to llamas of both sexes, all fiber types, and all ages. **Sign up on entry form.**

New This Year – Introducing a New Performance Division!

The Tenderfoot performance division is designed for handlers and/or llamas/alpacas who are still working on improving their performance experience and skills, with the goal of becoming more competitive in larger, ALSA sanctioned divisions. This is a non-ALSA *alternative* to the ALSA divisions. You may choose the Tenderfoot classes instead of Novice, Advanced, Masters or Youth, but may not show a Tenderfoot-entered lama/alpaca in any other performance division at this show. Handlers who qualify for Tenderfoot Handler, may also show in the ALSA divisions if they show an animal other than one shown in Tenderfoot at this show.

Tenderfoot Performance Lama/Alpaca

For a llama or alpaca to be eligible to compete in a Tenderfoot Performance Lama/Alpaca class at this show, that animal must have *never* won a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place ribbon in *any* ALSA-sanctioned performance class with 10 or more entries.

Tenderfoot Performance Handler

For a handler to be eligible to compete in a Tenderfoot Performance Handler class, that handler must have *never* won a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place ribbon in *any* ALSA-sanctioned performance class with 10 or more entries, with *any* llama or alpaca.

New This Year! Schooling Class at 8:00 a.m. Saturday, September 15

Have you ever wished for some practice and advice from a champion performance trainer and exhibitor before the show?

Introducing the Higher Ground Schooling Class!

1. The schooling class is designed for handlers (and/or llamas/alpacas) who are inexperienced or having some challenges with performance, and are looking for some pointers. Each handler may only enter one llama or alpaca in the schooling class.
2. The schooling class will contain six (6) obstacles that will be similar in level to those used in the Tenderfoot division being introduced at this year's show (which will be judged by Rob Knuckles, who's judging the rest of the performance show), but the obstacles in the schooling class are *not* being used in any of the other classes at the show.
3. Each exhibitor will navigate the course once around, getting up to two chances at each obstacle, with Brianna Evert, our coach-judge, following along with you, offering a few tips for how to navigate or improve at each obstacle and why.
4. After everyone has made their way through the schooling class with coaching, you will navigate the course one more time, and this time without any coaching, and will be scored and placed by Brianna like any other performance class. Exhibitors will be given their score cards to keep. Special ribbons will be awarded for your accomplishments in this class!

Open Obstacle Exhibitor's Choice

An unusual, challenging, super-fun timed obstacle course. Obstacles are rated according to difficulty - entry that successfully completes the largest number of obstacles that add up to the highest score, wins a special prize. Entries accepted until the first animal crosses the starting line. One class for llamas, one for alpacas!

World's Longest Llama Pack String

Fun, public-appealing competition to see who can lead the longest string of llamas through an obstacle class. Entries accepted until the first animal crosses the starting line. Special prize to winner!

Three Versatility Champions

One youth versatility championship and one open llama/alpaca versatility championship and one open alpaca versatility championship will be awarded to the animal scoring the highest overall in a combination of fleece (shorn or walking) and performance (obstacle, any level). Register at the show to qualify.

To be eligible, the llama or alpaca must be entered in both performance and fleece as listed above. Scoring details will be available at check-in. Special prizes to be awarded to these champions.

NOTE: Show management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if the number of entries in any individual class does not warrant a separate class.

Llama and Alpaca Fleece Show

Fleece Show Rules: See the ALSA Handbook – 2019 22nd Edition. Entry tags and display bags will be provided at check-in. Be prepared to supply your ALSA # and (for shorn fleece and walking fleece entries) your llama's ALSA #, along with a copy of your llama's ILR form.

Walking Llama Fleece: Fleece will be judged on the llama, by appointment on Saturday, September 16. Appointments to be made at check-in and at Saturday's exhibitor meeting. Judge will determine double, single

and suri coat divisions during judging. At the discretion of the Show Superintendent and, if there are fewer than four entries per class, age divisions may be combined. Sign up for the class in your appropriate age division:

LWF-36 Juvenile – 5-12 months

LWF-37 Yearling – 12-24 months

LWF-38 Two-Year-Old – 24-36 months

LWF-39 Adult – 36-60 months

LWF-40 Mature – 60 months and older

Walking Alpaca Fleece: Fleece will be judged on the alpaca, by appointment on Saturday, September 16. See ALSA Handbook – 22nd Edition, for judging details specific to walking alpaca fleece. Appointments to be made at check-in and at Saturday's exhibitor meeting. The judge will divide by fleece type and age. At the discretion of the Show Superintendent and, if there are fewer than four entries per class, age divisions may be combined.

AWF-41 Walking Alpaca Fleece

Shorn Llama Fleece:

Your entry may consist of entire shorn fleece but must include at least the barrel section minus skirting. At the discretion of the Show Superintendent and, if there are fewer than four entries per class, age divisions may be combined.

Finished Product Classes: These classes are intended to promote the use of llama and alpaca fiber by presenting educational displays of yarns and finished products made by the exhibitor. Items must be made of at least 60% Lama (Llama, Alpaca, Paco-Vicuna or Guanaco).

Divisions:

- Youth – combined 8 thru 18 years old age group.
- Novice – For the inexperienced fiber artist. This designation is determined initially by the fiber artist. After receiving 3 firsts in a class, the artist is required to move to advanced.

- Advanced – This division is for the experienced fiber artist. This designation is determined initially by the fiber artist. Once a product has been entered in advanced, it may no longer compete in novice.

LF12- Open Hand Spinner 's Choice

This is a 2 oz. sample of prime fiber from the blanket area. Fiber may be sheared or brushed; guard hair and debris must be removed. The judge will prepare a portion by carding and another by combing, and the spin the samples. Fiber must be 100 percent llama from an animal owned by the exhibitor. ***The sample must be received at the Fair Office Exhibitor Check-In by 6:00 p.m., Friday, September 15, or by mail no later than Thursday, September 14.*** (See Mail-in Entries)
